## We're building a new pedestrian bridge at the Glen Innes Station

Kia ora,

From next year, more and more people will use Glen Innes station. That's because the City Rail Link will unlock more frequent trains and new connections, making it easier to get around Auckland. Eastern Line trains will increase to every five minutes during peak times, with the potential for more in the future.

To enable more trains and provide safer access to Glen Innes Station, we're building a new accessible bridge to replace level crossings.

Construction will begin late October 2025, through to mid-2026 across different phases to align with KiwiRail closures to minimise disruption. Stage one will take place between 16 October to 28 October 2025. Hours of work will range from 6am to 8pm during the day, then 24/7 over Labour weekend.

Factors such as wet weather could mean a delayed start. If the delay is significant, we will notify you.

Here is what you need to know about the work happening near you:

Glen Innes Station on Apirana Avenue, Glen Innes (see work location map below)
<ul> <li>Work on the bridge will be completed over 8 months. We will be working in phases to align KiwiRail closures to minimise the level of disruption.</li> <li>The first stage will take place: <ul> <li>16 October to 23 October 2025 - Day Works: 6am to 8pm, some night works</li> <li>24 October to 28 October – 24/7</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
We will be in touch again with further details about the next phases.
We're building a new pedestrian bridge at Glen Innes Station to provide safer access and better connections to train services.
<ul> <li>Day works, and some nights – 16 October to 23 October</li> <li>Glen Innes station will operate as normal from 16 October to 23 October, with some changes to the pedestrian walkway into the station to avoid the construction works.</li> <li>The northern Park &amp; Ride car park will close from 16 October and remain closed until the works are completed.</li> </ul>



	<ul> <li>Labour weekend – 24 October to 28 October</li> <li>Glen Innes Station is closed for KiwiRail's planned rail maintenance. Work is underway for piling on the central platform.</li> <li>The station access from Merton Road will permanently close from 24 October as part of the final design and to ensure construction works can be carried out safely on the platform.</li> </ul>
	Works will create noise and vibration. We will have measures in place to mitigate noise impacts such as temporary noise barriers and continuous noise monitoring.
How travel is affected	Travel will remain open and accessible to all, with some minor detours to pedestrian routes.
	Traffic controllers will be on site to assist around the work site. Please follow all signs, light signals and traffic directions.
